

Success of the 43rd International Conference of the Association of Environmental Archaeology in Tarragona

Over 110 national and international experts gathered at the Palau Firal i de Congressos de Tarragona to explore and discuss the latest developments in the field of environmental archaeology.

Last November 24th to 26th, Tarragona became the epicenter of environmental archaeological research by hosting the 43rd edition of the International Congress of the [Association of Environmental Archaeology \(AEA\)](#).

The **poster prize** went to **Sabrina Bianco** (IPHES-CERCA) and colleagues for their project on charcoal material from excavations in Barcelona. The research synthesised the results in a way that told the story of the development of urban systems in Barcelona. These results are of interest to fields beyond anthracology (charcoal analysis) and demonstrates the relevance of environmental archaeology for the analysis of urban expansion.

The organizing committee at ICAC-CERCA gratefully received numerous congratulations, underscoring the success and relevance of the event. **The choice of Tarragona as the venue solidifies its position as an international hub for archaeological research**, highlighting the city's rich historical and cultural heritage.
