

Tarragona, international epicenter of environmental archaeology for 3 days

More than 110 national and international experts will gather in Tarragona from November 24 to 26 for the 43rd edition of the International Conference of the Association of Environmental Archaeology (AEA), organized by the Catalan Institute of Classical Archaeology (ICAC-CERCA).

The main focus of the event is environmental archaeology, a field of research that connects multiple disciplines of archaeology with environmental sciences (archaeobotany, zooarchaeology, geoarchaeology, etc.). This is one of the specialties of the **GIAP research group** at ICAC-CERCA, which is leading the organization of the conference.

The AEA2023Tgn conference aims to deepen the relationship and impact between past societies and their environments, especially in animal and plant ecosystems.
