The starting point dates back to the Executive Committee meeting in 2022, where the establishment of the well-known research career was approved as part of ICAC's HRS4R strategic plan.

Its implementation began in 2023 with the **external evaluation of three researchers from the Institute**, in accordance with national and international standards. This evaluation, coordinated by Maria Gradillas, ICAC's administrator and a member of the Evaluation Committee, was carried out by external experts, ensuring the impartiality and rigor of the process.

The favorable outcome of the external evaluation has allowed the promotion of researchers Ramon Járrega, Josep Maria Macias, and Josep Maria Palet to Research Professors.

ICAC-CERCA's **commitment to transparency** is reflected in the publication of the 2022 internal regulations on the center's website, along with the recognition of the right of all staff to request internal promotion, emphasizing the importance of regular evaluation.
